All competitors will be assumed to have read and agreed to abide by these conditions. Please take careful note:

- 1. Last date for entries. Please note that it will not be possible to accept entries after the date printed on the front cover of this syllabus stating last date for entries. Official entry forms must be used.
- 2. Acknowledgement of entries cannot be given separately from the timing/admission cards which are sent to all competitors just before the Festival.
- 3. All Challenge Trophies and Shields are the property of the Chester Competitive Music Festival Society and are held by winners for eleven months. They must be cleaned, adequately packed and returned to the following address NOT LATER THAN FOUR WEEKS PRIOR TO THE DATE OF COMPETITION to:

Winners are asked to include the trophy on their house contents insurance. No trophies can be taken outside the British Isles.

- 4. The decision of the Adjudicator shall be final.
- 5. Certificates will be awarded to all competitors with 75 or more marks. Cups and Awards will be given where applicable to winners who attain COMMENDED or higher.
- 6. The Committee reserves the right to appoint additional adjudicators and to alter, modify or cancel any arrangements in the syllabus as may be necessary.
- 7. A copy of the Own Choice item must be given to the Adjudicator before the performance.
- 8. A copy of the adjudicators' comments will be available to all competitors and should be collected from the secretary's desk together with copies of pieces. The Society does not hold itself responsible for copies left behind.
- 9. Competitors not answering to their number when called will be called again at the end of the class.

- 10. The sequence of class numbers in the syllabus does not necessarily indicate the order in the programme.
- 11. In the set pieces the stated edition must be used.
- 12. No piece may be used in more than one class.
- 13. N:o competitor or member of audience is permitted to approach the adjudicator during performance sessions.
- 14. All school groups must be adequately supervised.
- 15. Entry fees are to be paid in U.K. currency.
 Cheques are to be made payable to CHESTER COMPETITIVE FESTIVAL OF PERFORMING ARTS.
- 16. In accordance with the Performing Rights Society rules, we cannot permit the recording of any performance by tape or video or any form of flash photography or digital equipment.
